

#### Do you approve or disapprove of Joe Biden's performance as president of the United States?












# How would you qualify President Biden's handling of the following issues?





#### Between Trump and Biden, whom do you trust more to deal with each of the following topics?





#### In your opinion, should Joe Biden drop out of the 2024 race for president?







## In your opinion, what is the likelihood that Joe Biden will drop out of the presidential race?







### AtlasIntel was the most accurate pollster of the 2022 Constitutional Plebiscite in Chile

Public and private AtlasIntel polls accurately captured the dynamics of voter mobilization and came closer to the final vote count than any competitor.

AtlasIntel public releases both before and after the start of the poll blackout period indicated that slightly more than 58% of Chilean voters would vote to reject the new constitution; with 61,8% of votes cast against the new constitutional text, AtlasIntel came closest to the final outcome regardless of whether one considers polls released before or during the blackout period.




